1. To receive any apologies for absence

2. To receive any members' declarations of interest

01/20 None declared

3. To receive any Chairman's announcements

O2/20 Cllr Symonds opened by thanking the staff at the first meeting of the New Year. She had attended a senior citizens' Christmas meal with entertainment from TMTG and carol singing, which had been very good.

O3/20 Cllrs including the mayor had been invited to an informal get together of CATS (Carbon Action Thornbury & the Surrounding Areas) to find out the council's intended direction on climate policy. It was discussed that it was not appropriate for members to attend as representatives of the Council but could do so as individuals representing only themselves if they wished. A formal meeting with CATS was in the pipeline to allow CATS an input into the Council's climate change policy.

4. To receive any representations from the public

04/20 There were none present.

5. To consider and approve the minutes of the Meeting of Thornbury Town Council on 05.11.19 and the minutes of the Town Council (grants) on 05.12.19 and any matters arising from them

O5/20 Cllr Emmerson queried progress on paragraph 316/19. In the absence of any, Cllr Parkinson requested that the Clerk write to the churches in Thornbury, along with the Royal British Legion and cadets, to find out what their plans are for VE Day and if they wish the Council to be a part of them. The minutes were proposed as a true record by Cllr Tyrrell, seconded by Cllr Holloway and unanimously adopted.

O6/20 Cllr Fardell enquired whether there was an update following the grants processing. The Clerk reported that one organisation expressed concerned over the value of funding awarded and that Council also has concern over another organisation that is not currently operation. This would be discussed at the next relevant committee meeting. Cllr Emmerson brought to Council's attention that the minutes recorded he had declared an interest in two organisations, which was remarkable given that he had not in fact attended! It was agreed the minutes would be altered to reflect this. The minutes were otherwise proposed to be a true record by Cllr Stringer, seconded by Cllr Tyrrell and unanimously adopted.

6. To note the change of political party for a Town Councillor in South Ward

07/20 It was noted that Cllr Trueman had changed from Liberal Democrat to an independent councillor, subject to the Clerk receiving written confirmation.

7. To received reports from the following committees and any matters arising from them

(a) Environment Committee on 12.11.19

O8/20 The report was presented by Cllr Stringer, highlighting issues concerning tree planting, the closure of the composting site and perennial planting. The drinking water fountain at the Mundy Playing Fields was on hold due to ongoing work on splash pad improvements which affected it. A new recycling bin had been installed and a bench was still waiting due to staffing difficulties. Work to Poulterbrook was going ahead. Cllr Stringer proposed the report, seconded by Cllr Rawlinson and unanimously adopted.

(b) Playing Fields & Cemetery Committee on 12.11.19

O9/20 Cllr Parkinson presented the report, with the explanation that the war memorial situation was ongoing, a card had been sent to a committee member who was unwell and a correction was to be made to item 10. There was discussion surrounding the trader on the Mundy Playing Fields and this was going to the next committee meeting for resolution. A new grounds maintenance operative was starting tomorrow and another on Monday. The Clerk added that the redeveloped Osprey Park Playground was now open and was hugely popular. The report was proposed by Cllr Parkinson, seconded by Cllr Holloway and unanimously adopted.

(c) Town Development Committee on 10.12.19

The report was presented by Cllr Tyrrell who highlighted that a decision on the sale of Vilner woodland would take place in February. The Clerk confirmed that two letters had been sent to South Glos Council and copied to Luke Hall MP to set out Council's position. Cllr Tyrrell had received a letter from a member of the public regarding the condition that the Berkeley Hunt had left the Rock Street car park in following the Boxing Day meet. It was agreed this would be put on the next agenda. The report was proposed by Cllr Tyrrell, seconded by Cllr Holloway and unanimously adopted.

(d) Finance & Policy Committee on 19.12.19

Cllr Symonds presented the report. It was noted that at the Armstrong Hall Trust meeting, it had been decided that a grant of £80,000 would be requested from Council for the Armstrong Hall, rather than £90,000 as originally discussed. The report was proposed by Cllr Symonds, seconded by Cllr Emmerson and unanimously adopted.

8. To consider the following matters related to Council finance

(a) To approve the Accounts for Payment

- (b) To receive the financial report for month 8 (November) and an update on accounting matters
- Various points were clarified and discussed. The report was proposed by Cllr Stringer and seconded by Cllr Emmerson.
- (c) <u>To consider and approve the Council budget for 2020/21</u> 14/20

The clerk tabled an updated version of the Armstrong Hall budget. It was discussed that £80,000 would be requested as a grant from Council by the Armstrong Hall Trust, instead of the £90,000 as previously suggested. The £10,000 difference would be added into the Central Services budget as a named item, which would be available for the redevelopment project. Cllr Parkinson thanked the Clerk for her considerable work on the budget, which it was recognised was challenging without a permanent RFO. The locum RFO had been very valuable in putting the budget together and this was recognised also. The budget was proposed by Cllr Parkinson, seconded by Cllr Davies and unanimously agreed.

(d) To consider and approve any updates/changes to the Council's CIL programme 15/20

The paper was considered and discussed. It was proposed by Cllr Parkinson, seconded by Cllr Tyrrell and unanimously agreed.

(e) <u>To note correspondence from Avon Pension Fund about the 'McCloud Judgement'</u> 16/20

The correspondence was noted.

9. To consider planning and licensing applications

17/20 Council considered planning and licensing applications and agreed comments for submission to South Gloucestershire Council as per the attached schedule.

- 18/20 The Clerk noted she'd had thank you letters following the grants distribution. The letters came from the Pickleball Club, Lip Readers and The Arts Festival. These would be circulated to Councillors.

- The Clerk reported that a key light in the Town Hall had burnt out a needed a new LED light fitting. It was agreed this could be purchased.
