THORNBURY TOWN AND DISTRICT RESIDENTS' ASSOCIATION

Dear Mayor Davies

I am writing in connection with the proposed housing development on Butt Lane, which I believe is being opposed both by South Glos Council and Thornbury Town Council.

If there is one matter upon which TTADRA is in full agreement with the Town Council and South Glos Council, it is our concern over the rapid and poorly-planned expansion of our town to the north and north-west, all of which is happening without having the necessary infrastructure in place to deal with the healthcare and transportation needs of the swelling population. This is most particularly evident in the lack of an adequate, modern health and treatment centre, and in the regular traffic congestion in the centre of town; the latter caused by the need of the residents of the new estates, many of whom moved out of Bristol to find a quieter lifestyle, to return to the Bristol area for work on weekdays.

One solution to the problem, which has not recently been broached in public, as far as I am aware, would be the extension of the green belt northwards, to include all of Thornbury and the open fields north of the town, then directly westwards to border on the River Severn north of Oldbury-on-Severn, and directly eastwards to a border with the M5 motorway The current green belt extends from the outskirts of Bristol northwards to the southern edge of Thornbury and reaches up the Severn Vale as far as the southern edge of Oldbury.

A green belt is not a legislative matter, but a matter of policy, designed to prevent inappropriate development and/or ribbon development which joins up separate communities. Most green belts were designated many decades ago and no longer meet the purpose for which they were first intended. A green belt does not prevent further housing development but puts the onus on the developer to prove the need for development and to prove that the proposed housing meets all eco-requisites of modern living, including insulation, sustainability, and impact on the environment. The presumption, therefore, is not automatically pro-development, as is the case where no green belt is involved.

Since, according to public statements, both South Glos Council and Thornbury Town Council are intending to oppose the Butt Lane development, presumably on the grounds of preventing the joining up of Thornbury with Oldbury by ribbon development and on the basis of the current lack of the necessary health and transport infrastructures, the extension of the green belt to a point north of our town would also reduce or eliminate the chances of, e.g., Rockhampton and Buckover from being eventually absorbed into Thornbury.

Is this not a matter for Thornbury Town Council to take forward with South Glos Council as a matter of urgency and, one would hope, via the area's MP, Luke Hall, to gain the agreement of government to make the necessary change?
